***Et båt-mannskap (crew)*** - A fisherman was saved the other day just outside Sørøya in the very north of Norway.

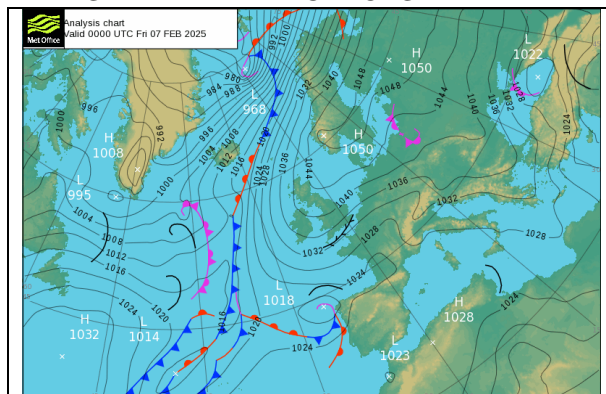

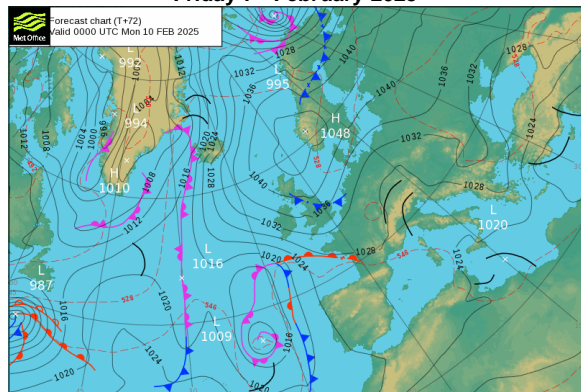

## GENERAL SITUATION Friday 7<sup>th</sup> February 2025

Statistically February is often a month of reasonably settled weather due to high or relatively high pressure developing either across the Norwegian Sea or over Scandinavia – usually making it the least windy month of winter.

This month is starting with a strong anticyclone (1046hPa msl) established across Scandinavia with a fresh easterly airflow expected to ease over the weekend as pressure builds across the Northern Isles. In the longer term high pressure is forecast to persist through much of next week with mainly dry and cloudy or partly cloudy conditions along with an often fresh and chilly southeast airflow persisting.

## OUTLOOK FOR THE WEEKEND

Temperatures 6° or 7° by day, 2° or 3° overnight.

**FRIDAY 7<sup>th</sup>:** Dry with cloud breaking and sunshine developing, F5 S winds easing F4. Dry though cloudy overnight with winds freshening F5. **Sea State:** Mostly rough at 4 metre W but E of Shetland S moderate at 2 metre.

**SATURDAY 8<sup>th</sup>:** Some brighter spells otherwise rather cloudy with chance of a shower. F5-6 SSE wind easing F4-5. **Sea State:** Mostly rough at 3 metre SSE.

**SUNDAY 9<sup>th</sup>:** Dry, cloudy or partly cloudy with sunny spells. F4 S winds easing F2-3. **Sea State:** Moderate at 2 metre S.

## FORECAST FOR NEXT WEEK

Temperatures around 5° or 6° by day, 2° to 4° overnight.

**MONDAY 10<sup>th</sup>:** Dry, rather cloudy with some brighter or sunny spells. Moderate SSE winds. **Sea State:** Mostly moderate at 2

metre SW. East of Shetland rough at 3 metre S.

**TUESDAY 11<sup>th</sup>:** Rather cloudy but remaining mostly dry. Feeling rather chilly in a freshening SE wind. **Sea State:** Mostly very rough at 4 to 5 metre SW. East of Shetland slight at 1 metre S.

**WEDNESDAY 12<sup>th</sup> – SUNDAY 16<sup>th</sup>:** Wednesday dry though cloudy with fresh SE to ESE winds. Thursday cloudy with fresh SE winds. Mainly dry at first with chance of showers later. Friday and the weekend mainly dry but cloudy with fresh SSE winds. **Sea State Wednesday:** Mostly moderate at 2 metre WSW. East of Shetland slight.
