Interview with Jonnie

1. What is your name?

Jonnie Fisk (Fisk is a Norwegian name meaning fish)

2. Where do you come from?

I'm from Yorkshire in England. I come from Harrogate in North Yorkshire. It is very famous for its spring water. The water used to have sulphur in it and the Victorians used to think it was good for them and drank loads of it! There is still a spring that you can visit and try it.

3. Where else have you lived before moving here?

I have lived in Newcastle, Durham and Hull. I also lived in Norway when I was a teenager. The island was called Vardo. It is in the arctic and the island was very flat. Between November and January the sun never rose. I was there working for an architects firm.

4. Why have you moved to Fair Isle and do you think you will be happy living here?

I have moved to work at the Bird Observatory, looking after the guests. I have worked at Spurn Observatory near Hull before. I really enjoyed it. Only 15 people could stay there at a time but it

was very busy with lots of people visiting during the day and lots of activities going on. People could stay at local B&Bs and hotels and come to the Obs during opening times.

I enjoyed being here last year so I'm sure I will this year.

5. Tell us about the new Bird Observatory.

The new Obs will be very fancy. All the bedrooms (23 for guests and more for staff) have their own bathroom. There will be a huge bar. I did my test this week so that I can run it. The views out of the Obs are amazing with floor to ceiling windows.

6. What are you busy doing just now?

Arranging the delivery of furniture, kitchen equipment, bedding etc. There are 130 pillows ordered!

7. When do you think the Bird Observatory will open?

We hope to open in May. Other staff are coming at the end of March.

8. What other staff will be coming?

2 housekeepers, 2 cooks, 2 assistant wardens and a ranger. The warden (Alex) is already here.

9. Have you got a favourite joke you can tell us?

My favourite jokes are all too naughty!

10. What is your favourite food?

I like spinach from Pat's garden and pistachio ice-cream.

11. Do you support a football team and if so, who is it?

No I don't support a football team but when I was little my mum made me tell people I supported Newcastle united!

12. What kind of music do you like and do you have a favourite singer/band?

I like loads of music especially older music. I don't like jazz. My favourite band is Fleetwood Mac.

13. Can you play any musical instrument and if so, what is it?

I can't play any musical instrument but I can whistle very well.

14. Do you have a favourite country you have visited?

Yes – I love Finland in the summer because of all the wildlife. I went to Oman about 9 years ago and that was amazing.

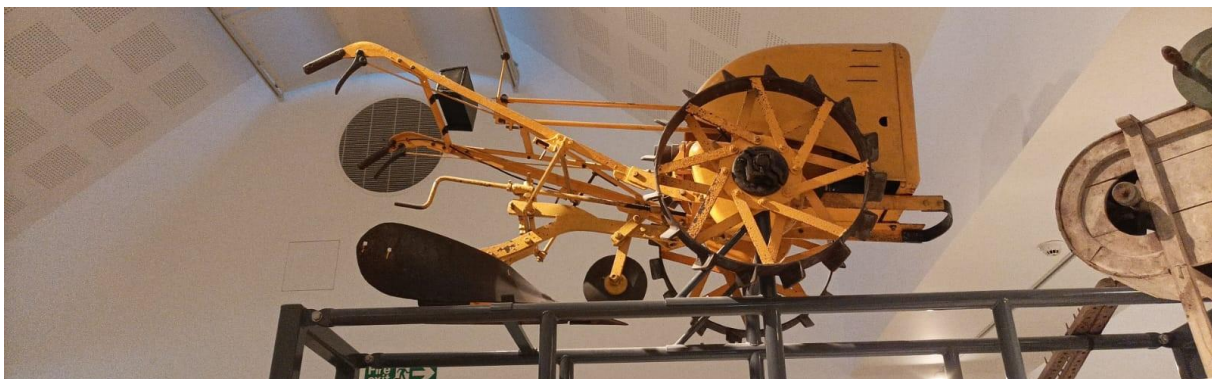

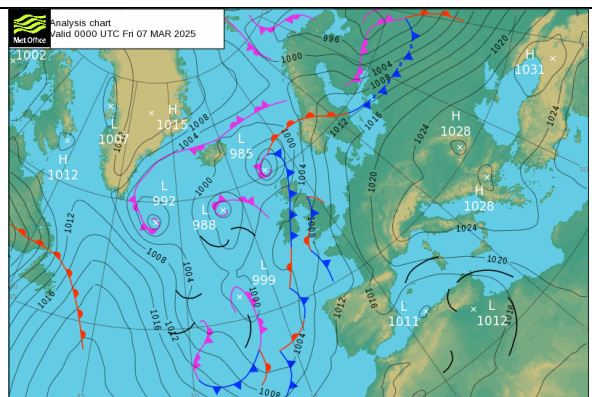

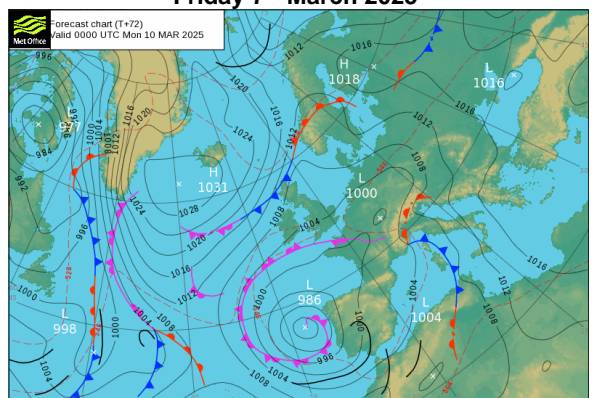

FAIR ISLE WEATHER FORECAST

GENERAL SITUATION Friday 07th March 2025

A small depression close to Shetland will move away northwards with a ridge of high pressure, extending into the British Isles from a European anticyclone, building north over the UK. A slack east to north-easterly airflow develops during the weekend as pressure builds in the Iceland area, backing and freshening northerly next week as an anticyclone develops over the north Atlantic. At the moment high pressure is predicted to decline southeast over the British Isles during the second half of next week.

OUTLOOK FOR THE WEEKEND

Mild by day at 8° or 9°. Nights a chilly 4° down to 2°.

FRIDAY 7th: A cloudy dry start, a fresh F5 W wind easing F3-4. The afternoon and evening dry with light winds and sunny or clear spells. Dry with clear spells overnight. **Sea State:** Mostly rough at 3 metre W but moderate SW at 2 metre east of Shetland.

SATURDAY 8th: Dry with sunny or clear spells at first, cloud increasing with rain reaching Fair Isle extending north to remainder of Shetland by evening. Light E winds freshening F4 then F5 ENE overnight. **Sea State:** Mostly moderate at 2 metre ESE.

SUNDAY 9th: Cloudy with NE winds freshening F5-6 and rain, this edging away southwards during the afternoon and evening. **Sea State:** Mostly moderate at 2 metre NNE.

FORECAST FOR NEXT WEEK

Colder at 4° or 5° by day, 1° to 3° overnight.

MONDAY 10th: Cloudy with showers, wintry at times, and mainly strong NNE winds. **Sea State:** Mostly rough at 3 to 4 metre NNE.

TUESDAY 11th: Cloudy with wintry showers and fresh N winds. **Sea State:** Moderate or rough at 2 to 3 metre NNW.

WEDNESDAY 12th – SUNDAY 16th: Wednesday cloudy with some wintry showers and fresh NNW winds. Cloudy on Thursday with scattered showers and lighter winds. Friday and the weekend cloudy though mostly dry with mostly light winds. **Sea State Wednesday:** Mostly moderate at 2 metre NW.
