
5. Sum up our amazing school in three words or one sentence.

FAIR ISLE WEATHER FORECAST



GENERAL SITUATION Saturday 28th June 2025

Expect a strong to gale force west south-westerly airflow today, this easing and backing south later Sunday as a small low swings in towards western Scotland. As the low continues north over Faeroe a southerly airflow on Monday veers westerly during Tuesday. Current models indicate an anticyclone building to the south of the UK next week while bringing warm weather across much of the country results in a cloudier westerly airflow across northern Scotland.

OUTLOOK FOR THE WEEKEND

Temperature 14° to 16° by day, 10° to 12° overnight. **SATURDAY 28**th: Brighter with sunshine by afternoon. Chance of a shower. Windy with F6 SW winds perhaps F7 to gale F8. Winds veer WSW overnight.

Sea State: Mostly rough at W 3 metre but SSW moderate at 2 metre east of Shetland.

SUNDAY 29th: Bright and mostly dry with sunny spells. F5-6 W winds easing and backing S overnight as rain arrives later.

Sea State: Mostly rough at W 3 to 4 metre but SW moderate at 2 metre east of Shetland.

FORECAST FOR NEXT WEEK

Temperature 14° or 15° by day 11° or 12° overnight.

MONDAY 30th: Cloudy with rain, heavy at times, misty with hill fog. Rain, occasionally heavy, clearing late in the night as light winds freshen NW.

Sea State: Mostly moderate at W 2 metre but slight at 1 metre SW east of Shetland. **TUESDAY 1**st: A bright day with scattered showers and occasionally fresh WSW winds.

Sea State: Slight or moderate at 1 to 2 metre SSW.

WEDNESDAY 2nd – SUNDAY 6th: Probably a reasonable amount of dry weather with sunny spells at first becoming generally rather cloudy with chance of showers. Fresh WSW winds easing W later.

Sea State Wednesday: Slight or moderate at 1 to 2 metre WNW.
