The Good Shepherd is continuing to sail to Lerwick at the moment. The weather has helped us a bit, but the short days and time of year will eventually cause more disruption. The new ferry project team is aware of this and have funded some sailings of a larger boat to augment my service. There's another trip this coming week (already full) and one the week after. The new ferry project has also budgeted for fresh goods on the plane when I request it. I've arranged for old cars that are shipped out to be collected but it must be understood that liability remains solely with the owner (including possible pier dues or any pollution incident etc).

There is also a contingency supply of heating oil and gas on the isle. Anyone needing fuel or gas should continue to buy as NORMAL for delivery from Lerwick (contact Eileen if you need home heating oil via the FIDC home delivery scheme).

I have a meeting at Grutness next week to look at the potential for getting back there in a few weeks' time. However, it'll not be service as usual, the store won't be available for deliveries and all items would have to come with Andrew Nicolson Transport on the sailing day. It's not going to be straightforward, but it might work.


### An additional update to our piece last week on Marie's exciting couple of weeks away from the isle...

I came back to Shetland on Monday after a lot of hesitation in London because there was a direct flight to Geneva and I had been thinking about visiting my sister. The weather was looking iffy for getting back to Fair Isle so I thought I might end up stuck in Shetland for the week. But I felt guilty prolonging my time away so I flew back to Shetland on Monday evening.

On Tuesday I waited all morning in Tingwall but there was no luck, the ice just wasn't melting. The forecast for the rest of the week made me really pessimistic and my sister had been so disappointed that I didn't end up visiting her, so I decided to head south again. I was meant to travel to Aberdeen on Tuesday night but that plane was cancelled. Somehow, against all my pessimism, there was a flight on Wednesday morning and after a long day of travel I finally got to be reunited with my sister on Wednesday night. I will stay for the weekend and attempt to get back home next week.

My sister has been on bed rest and unable to walk for three weeks following a double surgery on her feet so she is really happy to have me here. My mum has been caring for her all this time and honestly I don't know how they haven't killed each other yet! #### FAIR ISLE WEATHER FORECAST



**GENERAL SITUATION** Friday 28<sup>th</sup> November 2025

The gale to severe gale-force south-south-westerly airflow will turn westerly then northerly tonight as a deep depression west of Shetland moves away northwards as a filling feature. A fresh to strong cold northerly airflow eases through Saturday and Sunday as pressure builds across Scotland from the northwest. This freshens easterly early on Monday ahead of fronts driven east by the next Atlantic depression. Present forecasts suggest this depression will slip southeast across the south of the UK leaving a reasonably settled southerly airflow across the British Isle midweek. Later in the week this freshens as the next Atlantic depression drives associated fronts east towards the British Isles.

**OUTLOOK FOR THE WEEKEND** Weekend cooler 5° or 6° by day, 4° or 5° overnight.

**SUNDAY 30<sup>th</sup>:** A mainly dry day with some bright or sunny spells. F5 NNE winds easing F4 E, freshening F5 SE overnight bringing a spell of rain later in the night. **Sea State:** Mostly rough at N 3 metre.

**FORECAST FOR NEXT WEEK** Cool at first temperature 7° or 8° by day, 5° or 6° overnight. Then 8° or 9° by day, 7° or 8° overnight.

**MONDAY 1<sup>st</sup>:** Early rain soon clears to sunny spells and showers. Fresh SE to S winds. A cloudy night with patchy rain and fresh SE winds. **Sea State:** Moderate or rough at N 2 to 3 metre.

**TUESDAY 2<sup>nd</sup>:** Mainly dry and bright with fresh SSW winds. **Sea State:** Rough or very rough at SW 4 to 5 metre.

**WEDNESDAY 3<sup>rd</sup> – SUNDAY 7<sup>th</sup>:** A few showers Wednesday and Thursday with moderate or fresh E tending moderate or light SE to S. Thursday perhaps dry with moderate or fresh S winds. Friday dry with freshening SE winds. Then chance of outbreaks of rain with strengthening SE winds for the weekend. **Sea State Wednesday:** Moderate or rough at S 2 to 3 metre. **Dave Wheeler**
