Literacy

Listening and Talking

- We are learning to take notes as we listen and watch Newsround and other programmes.
- We are learning to ask and respond to a range of questions.

Reading

- Students will read assigned books throughout the week individually and as a group.
- We will be developing our knowledge of context clues, punctuation, grammar and layout to read unfamiliar texts with understanding.
- We are learning to identify purpose, main ideas and to find key information.

Tools for Writing

- We are taking part in a writing project to help improve students writing skills and interest in writing.
- We are learning to use a range of grammatical features to enhance our writing.
