Literacy

Listening and Talking

- We are able to ask and respond to different types of questions to show understanding of the main ideas of spoken texts.
- We are learning to make notes under given headings and use these to understand what we have listened to or watched and create new texts.

- We are learning to use new and topic related vocabulary which we have had repeated exposure to in appropriate contexts.

Numeracy and Mathematics

Numeracy - Number and number processes

- We are continuing to use addition, subtraction, multiplication and division when solving problems.
- We are developing ways of estimating and rounding answers to a calculation or a problem.
- We can compare, describe and show number relationships, using appropriate vocabulary and the symbols for equals, not equal to, less than and greater than.

Fractions

- We can explain what a fraction is using concrete materials, pictorials representations and appropriate mathematical vocabulary.
- We can compare the size of fractions and place simple fractions in order on a number line.
- We understand the role of the denominator and the numerator.
- We are learning how to find a fraction of an amount by applying our knowledge of division.

Money

- We can use money to pay for items and can work out how much change we should receive.
- We will investigate how different combinations of coins and notes can be used to pay for goods or be given in change.

<u>Data</u>

- We will explore how data is presented and ask and answer questions about the information it contains.
- We are able to collect information and sort it in a logical, organised and imaginative way.
- Using technology and other methods, we can display data simply, clearly and accurately by creating tables, charts and diagrams.
