

Curriculum Overview - Primary 6/7 - Term 2 2025/26 - Ms Murphy

Literacy

Enjoyment and Choice:

- Students will use the school library to select books they enjoy.
- Students will have an opportunity to create stories during Free Choice Friday.

Listening and Talking-

- Presentation skills- Students will build on their ability to present their ideas/arguments/presentations to their peers and build their confidence in public speaking.
- Students will learn lines, take direction and act in the Hamnavoe School Play.

Reading/Finding information

- Students will read a book of their choice daily for 15 minutes. Students should be reading their book at home each week to help increase their reading fluency and confidence.
- Students will continue to build on their comprehension skills through weekly tasks.
- Spelling- students must complete a set of tasks based on their assigned spelling words. Spelling test is done weekly.
- November Readathon- Students will engage in a reading challenge throughout November which will be run by P6/7.

Writing

- Students will work on paragraphs this term specifically working on time and place.
- Students will continue writing their 500-word story. (due 7th November)

Numeracy and Mathematics

Multiplication

- Revise table facts to 12 to solve number and word problems.
- Multiplication of a 2-/3-digit numbers by 10, 100 and 1000.
- Introduce a range of mental multiplication strategies based on doubling and/or halving.
- Consolidate multiplication of any 2-/3-digit number by a single-/2digit number using informal and standard written methods.
- Introduce using factors as a strategy for multiplying a pair of 2-digit numbers.
- Consolidate multiplying 4-digit numbers by a 1-digit number and multiplying 3-digits by 2-digits using formal written methods.

Division:

- Revise mental division by 2-10.
- Consolidate finding mentally half of a certain 3-/4- digit number.
- Introduce mental and written strategies for division.
- Consolidate division of a three-digit number by a single digit using informal and standard written methods.
- Consolidate dealing with remainders and rounding answers.

Number Properties:

- Consolidate knowledge of number sequencing and using 'rules' to describe or generate number sequences.
- Investigate types of numbers- square, odd, even
- Develop knowledge of multiples and factors and their links with square and prime numbers.
- Introduce finding the rule or word formula to describe a relationship between 2 sets of numbers.

Climate Change

- I can discuss the environmental impact of human activity and suggest ways in which we can live in a more environmentally responsible way.
