Curricular Area	Subject	Topic(s)
Languages	<b>English</b>	<b>DA:</b> Writing Improvement Programme: Punctuation and sentence structure. <b>CM:</b> Students will complete a range of reading tasks linked to <i>Stone Cold</i> by Robert Swindells. These will focus on understanding the text, exploring themes and characters, and developing key skills such as inference, analysis, and personal response.
	<b>French</b>	Language focus around <b>hobbies</b> . Grammar focus - conjugating verbs and asking and understanding questions.
Numeracy	<b>Maths</b>	Rounding, speed, distance and time, further applications of fractions, decimals and percentages including money, the 4 operations for fractions, removing brackets and solving harder equations and inequalities.
HWB	<b>PE</b>	Pupils will be completing a football and a rugby unit where they will develop their fitness, coordination and skill specific to each topic.
	<b>Life Skills</b>	Pupils will be learning about healthy diets and the importance of sleep.
	<b>RME</b>	'Rites of Passage: Marking Life's Stages: Comparative Religion
	<b>Home Ec</b>	Pupils will be working on 'Getting the Balance Right' unit this term. Through a range of practical and written activities, we will be looking at the link between diet and health. Studying dietary goals and their benefits to health and studying the sources and function of nutrients.
Science	<b>Science</b>	<u>Physics</u> – light: the eye, lenses and their applications.
Social Studies	<b>Geography</b>	Shaping our Landscape – looking at how the physical landscapes around the world have been created and continue to change – coasts, volcanoes, earthquakes and tsunamis.
	<b>History</b>	Students will learn about equality, diversity and human rights. A look at social structures within the UK. Human rights, what are they, a comparison of rights across the world. The rights of the child.
	<b>Modern Studies</b>	
Expressive Arts	<b>Art</b>	Pupils will look at illustration and sharing info visually by creating their own recipe book designs. We will then look at proportion and scale by creating pop art celebrity portraits.
	<b>Music</b>	Popular music. Pupils will learn to recognise features of different styles of popular music. They will also keep developing individual skills on an instrument of their choice.
Technologies	<b>BIC</b>	How do businesses make us buy their products? We will be looking at the 4Ps of marketing (price, place, product and promotion) towards the end of the term they will run a business scenario to make the most profit.
	<b>Technical</b>	Starting on the small wooden stool project. Looking at two point perspective in technical drawing.
