



TERMLY OVERVIEW

PRIMARY 6 - 7 TERM 4 2025/2026

Topic Enterprise

Learners will take part in a "summer fair" enterprise project, by working in small groups to design and run their own stall. Developing teamwork, communication skills and problem-solving. Pupils will learn about money management by budgeting for resources, setting prices, and calculating profit. After the event, learners will reflect on their success, considering what worked well and how they could improve in the future.

Topic Country study

Learners will explore the landscapes of Scotland and its key features, developing a deeper understanding of the world around them. They will compare their local area with a contrasting region to investigate how the physical environment influences land use. Through map work, pupils will build their sense of place by locating important features within Scotland, the UK, and the wider world. Learners will also examine different ways people travel, considering the advantages, disadvantages, and environmental impacts of transport. In addition, they will explore how food choices are influenced by factors such as culture, religion, availability, and cost.

Homework

Pupils will receive weekly spelling patterns on Mondays to practise throughout the week. We will have a spelling challenge on Friday to test their words.

Pupils will receive reading homework on Mondays.

Pupils will receive a times table to learn on Mondays and a check in on Thursday.

Literacy

Reading - Pupils will continue to read a variety of books in class and we will do ERIC time after lunch. We will also focus on comprehension skills. This term our class novel will be *The Witches* by Roald Dahl

Writing - learners will develop their writing skills through creating informative leaflets. They will focus on organising ideas clearly, including relevant information, and using appropriate tone and vocabulary for their audience. Pupils will also apply key features of each genre to produce well-structured and engaging writing.

Spelling - Will be done on Fridays. New spelling words every Friday.

Listening and Talking - will be embedded through topic work and classroom discussions, pupils will deliver personal talks of their choice.

Health and wellbeing

Health and wellbeing topics for this term:

PE- will be done with our PE specialist teacher, Mr Williamson on Fridays.

Class PE with Miss McLean will be on Mondays.

This term we will be focusing on food and hygiene, learners will also reflect on their achievements, strengths and areas for development through self and peer assessment. They will develop confidence in recognising transferable skills by participating in presentations and exploring careers, linking their experiences in school to future pathways and aspirations.
