Maths

Circles – Practise counting up and down in 2s up to 20, 3s up to 30 and 5s up to 50. Go outside and find sticks/stones/make snowballs/etc to help you.

Squares – We are going to practise the 3, 4, 6, and 8 times tables. Go outside and find sticks/stones/make snowballs/etc to make groups to help you with your times tables.

For example,

```
3 x 1 = 3
3 sticks in 1 group. 3 sticks altogether.

3 x 2 = 6
3 sticks in 2 groups. 6 sticks altogether.

3 x 3 = 9
3 sticks in 3 groups. 9 sticks altogether.

Continue up to 3 x 10 =
```

Practise the 3 and 6 times table - do you see a pattern?

Now practise the 4 times table and the 8 times table - do you see a pattern?

Triangles – We have been learning to use the jump strategy to add numbers up to 1,000. Today, I would like you to practise adding numbers up to 10,000. Use the jump strategy to find the answers to the following questions:
