Literacy

- Spelling - Practise familiar spelling patterns and learn new patterns using a variety of strategies.
- Continue to revise letter formation and write on the line consistently using the correct heights.
- Further develop use of nouns, proper nouns, verb tenses, adjectives, introduce apostrophes and simple prepositions and contractions.
- Check on development of interesting vocabulary to engage reader by parsing simple sentences.
- Differentiated use of varied punctuation.
- Further develop oral and written comprehension skills.
- Reading for meaning - discussion around flow, intonation and fluency when reading aloud, concentrating on questioning for deeper understanding of preferences in fiction and non-fiction texts.
