Playdough Literacy - can you the play dough into the first letter of your name? what sound does that make? Can you use a stick to write your name in the play dough?

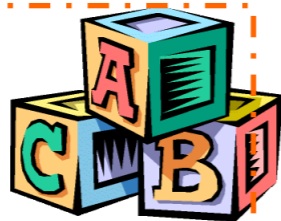
Phonics - Focus on a sound a

- Playdough is fun to make

Playdough nursery

recipe:

- 1 cup plain flour
- 1TBSP oil
- 1TBSP cream of tartar (optional)
- ½ cup salt
- 1 cup lukewarm water
- Add any colouring, scent, petals, glitter etc to personalise

Method:

- Add all ingredients into large bowl
- Mix together with a spoon
- Dust work surface with a little flour and kneed until it forms a soft dough consistency
- Store in an airtight container
- This will last around 3 days.
