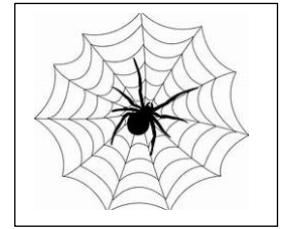


## Daily tips for Playful Learning at Home

#### What do I need?

A quiet space to sit with your child

#### What do we do?

Practice wriggling you fingers ready for the rhyme

*Incy Wincy spider climbed up the waterspout  
Down came the rain and washed the spider out  
Out came the sunshine and dried up all the rain  
Then, Incy Wincy spider climbed up the spout  
again*

#### What will your child learn from this play?

To listen and change the actions to suit the words.

They will develop their finger movements

Some new words e.g. waterspout

Explain to your wee one what a waterspout is

Follow the actions on the clip or create your own

Repeat the song as often as your child wants

#### How can you take it further?

Talk about spiders and other creepy crawlies your child might know or have seen.

Talk about the differences between them – e.g. spiders have 8 legs

Look at books/online at different insects and draw your own
