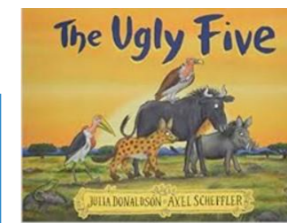

I can enjoy watching, reading or listening to different texts, including stories, songs and rhymes, and can share likes and dislikes

Literacy - Fingerprint names! Get your grown up to write down the letters of your name in big letters on some paper. Using your fingers and some different coloured paints can you make fingerprints to follow the shapes of the letters? This would make a lovely sign for your bedroom door once its finished! Or in your window to brighten up someone's walk.

Benefits - this is a great fine motor skills activity, great for letter formation and lots of fun!



I choose to make marks to communicate information within play and using their knowledge.



Phonics - Focus on a sound a week:

this week 'c/k'

Have a hunt in house and see what find starting with

'c/k'. Draw and write pictures starting with 'c/k'. Can you be **creative**? How can you keep **calm**? Can you **camp** inside/out? Can you play with a **kite**? Can you be **kind**? Can you be a **King**?

I can communicate and shares stories in different ways, for example, in imaginative play.

PE suggestion: Obstacle Course - Indoors or out, set up an obstacle course. For example crawl under tables, climb over chairs, jump over ropes, hop from cone to cone, crawl through a cardboard box, jump through a line

I can move in different ways e.g. run, jump, gallop,
I am beginning to link simple movement skills together in a sequence in order to catch, throw, kick etc



Rhyme: Old Macdonald had a farm I'm sure you all know this rhyme, can you sing it to your family? Can you draw them? Can you make your own farm? See below for more ideas! <https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resources/literacy/nursery-rhyme/old-macdonald-had-a-farm>

I can hear and say rhyming words and generates rhyme from a given word.

For Fun! This is a super fun, crafty breakfast activity. Try this to make some arty toast! All you need is some bread, food colouring and a little bit of milk.

First you must wash your hands, remember to sing Happy Birthday two times! Then mix some food colouring with a little bit of milk and using a clean paintbrush, get arty! Paint whatever pictures you like onto your bread then get your grown up to toast your creation!! We would love to see some of your creations on your Learning Journal.



- I can get ready to prepare food, for example, wash hands, tie hair back, wear an apron
- I can draw/ talk about my favourite foods

Numeracy - Pizza Counting! We all love pizza right?! So lets try some pizza counting! All you need is two paper plates, some sticky dots (or pens to draw dots will work the same), some scissors and a black pen. On one Pizza, use a pen to draw the triangles of the pizza and on each triangle write a number. On the second pizza cut the same triangles but this time use dots to make the same numbers. Cut out the triangles and try and match the dots to the numbers to fill the pizza up again!

Benefits - Encompassing scissors skills, fine motor skills and counting and recognising different numbers.

I can represent some numbers to 10 using symbols and objects
I can use concrete materials to count a set of objects
I can count when asked 'how many?'
