DIGITAL LITERACY

- Between 1.5 and 2.5 hours weekly timetabled access to laptops, ipads and tablets for each class
- 69 devices shared with home including Laptops and tablets, including Digital Inclusion devices

- Improved digital skill for almost all learners and staff
- P5-7 learners developed programming skills through participation in STEM Workshops
