Literacy and English

Reading:

- \sim I can discuss the structure, characterisation and setting of a text; identifying why a writer has created them in a particular way.
- ~ I can describe a character's feelings and point of view.
- ~ I can identify themes in a text and relate these to my own experiences.
- \sim I can look for words and phrases an author has used in order to create an effect or to impact upon their reader.
- ~ I can give my opinion about the text and can justify my thoughts.
- ~ I can answer literal, inferential and evaluative questions about what I have read.

Writing (including grammar, spelling and punctuation):

- ~ I can use the features of different genres in creating stories, poems and plays.
- ~ I can check my work carefully in order to edit and improve.
- ~ I can check my work carefully to ensure it makes sense.
- ~ I can use success criteria to identify and evaluate if my writing has met its purpose.
- ~ I can present my work using different lettering and graphics in order to engage my reader.

Listening and Talking

Maths and Numeracy

Topics to be covered this term in differentiated groups include: Money:



- ~ I can read and write monetary values using the correct notation.
- ~ I can add and subtract monetary values with a decimal point.
- ~ I can work out the cost of an item or selection of items.
- ~ I am able to apply strategies I can use for whole numbers to monetary amounts.
- ~ I can solve real life problems involving money
- ~ I choose the best method of written and mental calculation strategies to add, subtract, multiply and divide with money and use technology when appropriate.
- ~ I can find the cost of items from a range of sources/retailers to find the best value including calculating discounts, delivery charges etc.
- \sim I can compare the price of goods against my given budget and determine if I can afford to buy them.
- ~ I can talk about profit and loss in buying and selling activities and make calculations for this.
