- drop a spoon of Mix on a tray with Grease proof paper.
- Sprinkle with Sugar then Put in the Oven for 20 mins.

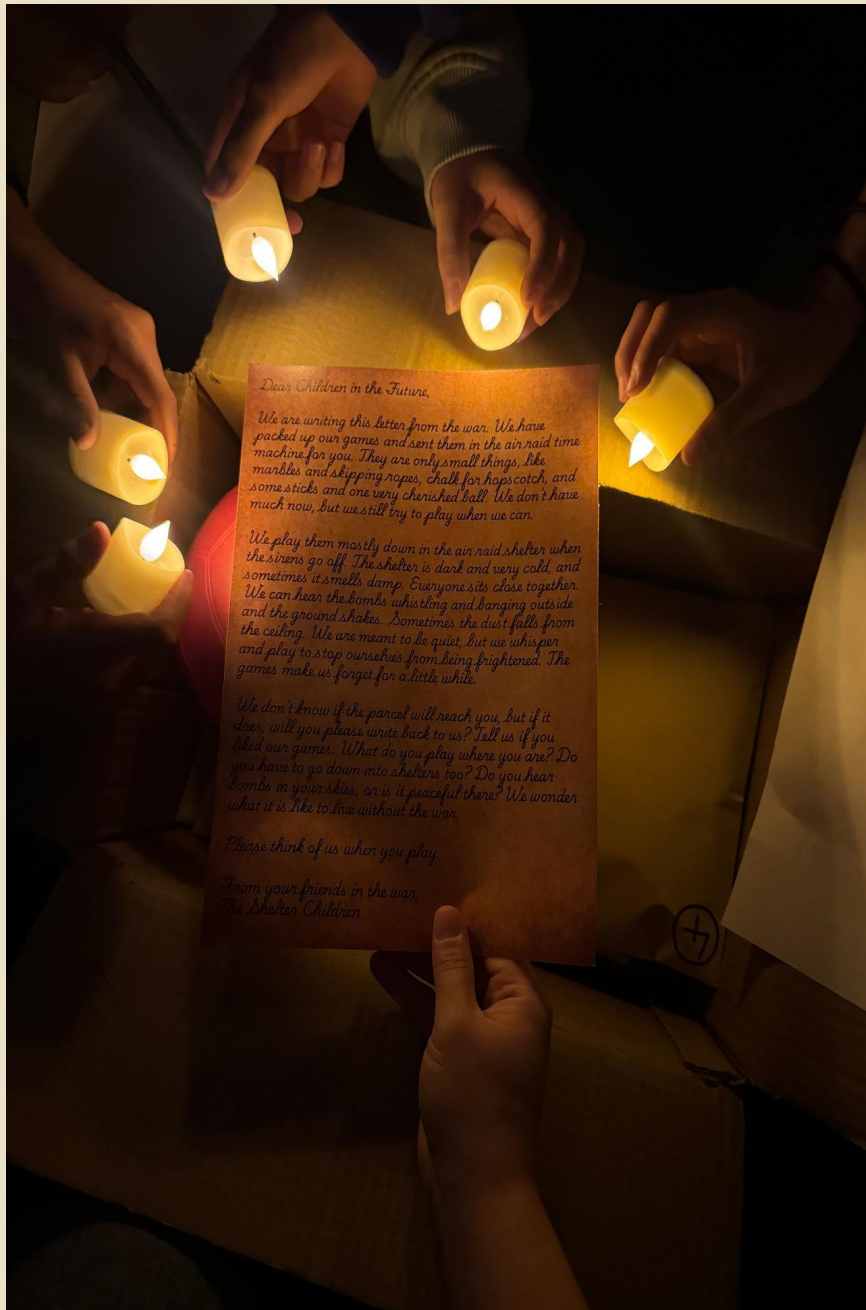








During an air raid drill in P6/7...
