

At the Learner Led Event in September 2025, we asked you a few questions to gather your thoughts about some specifics. There wasn't a huge response, but we have collated what you shared and have been looking at what our next steps could be.



Primary 1/2/3

ANIMALS TOPIC

LITERACY

P1s have been so busy this term learning their first letters and sounds.

P2s and P3s have had a BIG focus on sentence writing this term, and just how important writing in sentences is. They have had lots of fun making up silly sentences with our sentence makers.

We have all done lots of writing connected to our topic, like writing about our favourite animals, writing about which animal we'd choose to be, and creating our own animal stories.



MATHS

- P1s have been focussing on becoming really confident with their numbers to 10.
- P2s have been focussing on adding numbers up to 20, and particularly using mental skills.
- P3s have been working with trickier adding skills up to 100 and beyond .
- 4. We have all been learning about 2D shapes. We have done lots of topic maths, including creating 2D shape animals and tesselated animal pictures. We had lots of fun with these activities!

Although we've been very busy th term with our maths and literacy, we've been learning lots about animals too. We have:

- Learned about different animal classifications, like 'mammal' and 'amphibian'.
- Learned about food chains and food webs and how these show the predators and prey.
- Created our own 'Italian Brainrot' characters.
- Learned about extinct and endangered animals. We have thought about ways to help endangered animals.



HEALTH & WELLBEING

We have enjoyed a lot of collaborative play this term, including plenty of construction with blocks and loose parts.



Maths

We have been exploring numbers to 10,000 and 100,000 this term. Everyone has demonstrated such a positive attitude towards their work. We have used Sumdog to reinforce learning and even played Blooket to practice our number skills.

Writing

We have been doing daily writing to try to improve the quality of our work. We have written about everything from castles, Disney characters and even Labubu dolls!

We are seeing some good progress

We have thoroughly enjoyed our topic about Scotland this term. We have created posters, fact files, used maps, made power point presentations, presented to the class, baked shortbread, made Loch Ness Monsters and created pictures based on Scottish artists.

Math:

We have been increasing our knowledge of adding and subtracting. In our SHM textbooks, we have been working on and practicing word problems. In our jotters, we have been writing out chimney sums to help us understand how the problems work. For our classroom jobs, we also work with money. Every day, pupils earn money through our classroom economy by doing their jobs. This has been another great way to practice our adding and subtracting.

Writing:

Recently, we have been writing imaginative stories to keep us entertained in the Air Raid Shelter. We have been impressed by the ones that have been read out loud and are excited to hear more stories from different perspectives. To earn our trip to the museum, the class wrote letters to Ms. Simpson and Mari Anderson. We also wrote recounts of our museum trip. In addition, we wrote letters back to the Shelter children, telling them about the future and our experiences with their games that were sent from the past. Our current success criteria has been focusing on punctuation.

Topic:

Our P6/7 topic is World War II. Our class has found this topic very interesting, and here is what we have learned. We have been working on rationing (we made a lemon cake using ingredients that would have been rationed), identity cards (pupils must carry them everywhere!), air raid shelters (we even have our own siren and shelter for practice), blackout drills, gas masks, evacuation, ARP Wardens (we've got our own ARP whistle and helmet), and WWII games (we recently received a package with a letter and games to play from The Shelter Children). Finally, we are learning about important battles, doing research, and making posters. We will use the posters to teach the class and then quiz each other on what we remember.

P.E.:

During PE with Mr. Kirkness, the class has been enjoying handball and, more recently, hockey. In our class PE sessions, we have been playing netball. Everyone has worked really well in teams and has been great at learning new skills!

Reading:

Every morning, the class gets into their reading groups and reads part of their novel. Usually, they listen to the audiobook while reading along, but sometimes they read a chapter or two to each other. Every book is connected to World War II, linking with our topic. We have also finished reading Once by Morris Gleitzman and are now moving on to Then for our class novel!
