# P123 - Term 2

## Literacy

- ~ We have been enjoying reading and writing playscripts this term. We used the story of the *Three Little Pigs* to write playscripts and we had so much fun with these!
- ~ We have been enjoying making posters and signs for both our show and our Enterprise Project.
- ~ We have learned how to write invitations, and we have enjoyed writing and making these.
- ~ We have been developing our listening and talking skills this term as we have been rehearsing and performing our show, *Wriggly Nativity*.
- ~ We have been learning about how to share ideas respectfully in our enterprise groups.

## Maths

- ~ P1s have been continuing to develop their number writing, recognition and counting to 10. They are so confident with their counting and are already venturing beyond 10.
- ~ P2 & P3 have been developing their understanding of subtraction. They have also been learning about using inverse operations to complete calculations. They have been using what they know about addition to help with subtraction questions.
- ~ P1, P2 & P3 have been increasing their knowledge and understanding of money, specifically coins. Everyone has been working on using coin combinations to pay for amounts.

## Enterprise

- ~ We have been learning a lot of communication and cooperation skills as part of our Enterprise project.
- ~ We found it tricky at times to make group decisions, and we have spent a lot of time developing our understanding of how to compromise.
- ~ We have worked in our small groups to create a business name and logo.
- ~ We have learned about the term 'Profit' and have calculated an amount to sell our items for, so that we can make a profit.
- ~ We have learned about some simple jobs within a company and we have each taken on a simple role in our group.
- ~ We have enjoyed creating a stall and selling our products.

## Learning Across the Curriculum

- ~ We have really enjoyed rehearsing and performing our show.
- ~ We loved the chance to dress up in our costumes, and to make props.
- ~ Through our show rehearsals, we have learned the story of the first Christmas. We have enjoyed making pieces of art with a nativity focus.
- ~ We have enjoyed seasonal activities and play this term, from Halloween potion making and fireworks poetry to Christmas activities.

## Term 2

### Math:

During Term 2, we have continued to practise and build confidence with addition and subtraction methods, while also developing our multiplication and division strategies. We have learned how to do long division, which has helped us solve problems involving larger numbers. We are still working hard to memorise our times tables.

We have continued with our classroom jobs and wages as part of our classroom economy. With such a busy term, we sometimes had to calculate double or even triple wages, which really tested our math skills. Some pupils have saved a lot of money for classroom privileges, showing great responsibility and numeracy skills.

### P.E.:

In PE this term, we have been focusing on basketball. Our movement and passing skills have improved greatly. The netball club also competed in their first fixture, beating Whalsay 7-0 — a fantastic achievement!

### Reading:

To finish off the term, we have been enjoying a funny book about a Christmas pageant, which has been a lovely way to end a busy and exciting term.

### Writing:

In writing, we have continued to develop our use of punctuation and sentence openers. We have also explored similes and metaphors to help us describe things in more detail. We learned about limericks, rhymes and syllables, which linked perfectly with our pantomime script, as many of us were unfamiliar with this style of performance. These activities helped improve our creativity and confidence in writing.

### Topic:

Our main topic this term has been our pantomime. We have put in an incredible amount of time, effort and teamwork. The class has been practising lines, creating and painting props, writing limericks, changing parts of the script, helping each other remember lines, and singing songs.
