DID YOU KNOW?

 Listening skills are important for understanding language and talking, playing and interacting with others and for children to successfully develop literacy skills.

TRY AT HOME

- To listen effectively we need to look at the person who is talking, stay still and listen to all the words.
- You can practise listening skills by playing these games with your child.
- · Take turns hiding the teddy.
- The person who hides the teddy gives clues to the person finding the teddy e.g. it is below something soft, it is behind something red.
- The person looking for the teddy will need to use their listening skills to find the teddy.
- You could negotiate rules by agreeing how many clues are allowed.

OTHER THINGS TO TRY

- Sharing a book together is a great way to encourage listening skills.
 You can also make up stories together.
- Take turns holding the teddy, while you are holding the teddy it is your turn to speak about teddy's adventures.
