Science:

Explore genetics and DNA. Distinguish between inherited and non-inherited characteristics.

Discuss the environmental impact of human activity and think about how we can live in a more environmentally responsible way.

Health and Wellbeing:

Look at different kinds of advertising and categorise. Plan a mini advert considering techniques we have been learning about. Discuss reactions people might have. Explore substance misuse and the media. Think about how this might affect our choices. Consider impact on family and friends.

Make leaflets about food and nutrition. Explore links between energy, exercise and health and wellbeing. Explore body image/airbrushing/magazines and discuss. Topics on body changes, how human life begins, how babies are born, the roles of parents,

friendships/relationships and protecting ourselves from all forms of abuse.

Media and Advertising/ John Muir Award

<u>Visiting teachers</u> <u>Art:</u> Complete optical illusions. Mirror design. Pop art portraits. Visual elements check. Tints and shades painting. **Music** Creating music combining music technology and traditional instruments.
