
Ethos and Life of the school

Opportunities for personal achievement

Curriculum areas and subjects

Literacy - Weekly spelling and grammar. Weekly extended writing linked to interdisciplinary learning wherever possible using the VCOP approach. Writing about news. Guided reading 3/4 times per week and daily opportunities to read for pleasure. Linked activities to the class novel.

Numeracy - Addition and subtraction strategies, number talks, SEAL maths. Missing numbers. Problem solving. Money. Dates of Birthdays and yearly calendar. Multiplication and division strategies.

Health and Wellbeing - Zones of Regulation. Friendships and working cooperatively. Co-operative learning games and activities. Building Self -esteem activities. Circle time games.

French - Building on previous vocabulary - My family, names, ages, animals, classroom objects and instructions. Christmas and birthday celebrations. Christmas songs and vocabulary. Games.

RME - Festivals, Places, and ways of Worship

 $\mbox{\bf PE}$ – How the body works. How to be Healthy. Striking games – including Racquet Sports and Cricket.

Music - We will continue to build on rhythm skills from last term and introduce pitch by playing simple melodies and rhythm patterns on boom whackers and chime bars. We will use music with a Christmas theme to practice these skills later in the term.
