Curriculum areas and subjects

<u>Health and Wellbeing:</u> Continually reinforce handwashing, good manners and healthy choices for snack and lunchtimes.p3 Eatwell plate activities- balanced diet. Friendships and co-operative/paired activities, using kind words, developing confidence and consideration for others. Our Families - how they are all different/People who help and look after me. Safe and active play outdoors

<u>Literacy and English:</u> Show and Tell weekly /Drawing Club/Imagination creations, P1 - phonic sound ck,e,h,r,m,d., games and formations daily. Word building and reading CVC words and some sight/tricky words. ORT characters and reading books, games. P2 - Spelling and tricky words, wordboxes, word and sentence building, connectives, question marks P3 - spelling patterns, descriptive writing, connectives, begin joined writing. P2/3 Writing news, labelling diagrams, write simple imaginative stories. Daily reading and comprehension activities.

Numeracy P1 number bonds to 10, Addition and Subtraction to 10, counting to 20, SEAL maths. P2 addition and subtraction within 10 then 20, odd/even, number bonds to 20. SEAL maths. P3 numbers to 1000, add and subtract within 100, estimation

<u>Mathematics</u> Money- paying for objects, recognising coins- paying fro snack. enterprise activity, <u>Time-timetables</u>, <u>birthdays</u>, <u>days of the week, months</u>, <u>calendars</u>, <u>seasons</u>, telling the time-digital and analogue. Symmetrical activities- link to Christmas and festivals. 3D and 2D shapes- practical activities.

<u>French</u> new vocabulary for classroom instructions and objects play games eg. Kims game. Christmas vocabulary and French Christmas customs, learn a Christmas song.

<u>Drama</u> Rehearsals and performance for Christmas concert

<u>RME</u> <u>Inclusion and the beliefs of different groups of people.</u> Use simple examples in class to demonstrate.

<u>Art:</u> Firework scraperboard. Watercolour and ink tree decoration. Dala horse. Peerie Santa 3D decoration. Christmas still life. Collage snowflakes. P1/2 Beach glass Christmas tree <u>Music</u> singing rounds and for Christmas performance. Rhythm, music games and exploration of Xylophones, bass quitar and drums.

<u>PE</u> The class will develop and improve their large ball skills and teamwork skills through a range of games and practices. Improving their communication and developing their problem solving skills.

Progress will be evidenced through planned periodic high quality assessments-showing application of knowledge.


Remembrance Day - Assembly, make poppies

Birthdays- design birthday cakes, practice months, dates, and calendars **Diwali/Hanukah**- watch online video clips, make diva lamps, candle pictures, link to sources of light. Create a Rama and Sita display.

Christmas- drama, songs, crafts, make cards, decorations, Party games Children In Need - Plan and prepare coin collection fundraising, link to maths work, make posters, dressing up.
