4. Friends of Hallside (SS)

- FOH hosted a summer fayre on Saturday 3rd June from 11am 2pm.
- Lots of parents provided help on the day to man stalls.
- Event was a success with monies being generated that will benefit the school pupils.
- FOH are meeting regularly and minutes from the last meeting have been typed up and will be available from the school website.
- SS advised that discussion had taken place re: the facebook post that had adverted this event
 prior to it being formally communicated to the school community. Apologies were given from
 the individual who did this, the intention was to raise awareness of the event rather than
 cause any upset to members of the Parent Council/ former members of FOH.

5. Fundraising sub group (LM, ES, AS)

- The funding sub group have not managed to meet but two funding application have been submitted.
- Both applications have been successful.
- SLC Sustainability grant has been awarded for £2,500. The application made was for funds to allow the school to purchase bikes and provide Bike Ability training to school pupils. Due to issues with the HPC bank account, this money has not yet been paid into the HPC account.
- Tesco application will appear in 3 local Tesco stores where shoppers will vote for 3 communities initiatives via blue coin tokens. There is potential for the school to be awarded one of three amounts £1,500, £1,000 or £500. This money will go towards a school garden.
- The school office will send out an email to the school community to advise them of this opportunity and encourage customers to vote for the school.
- ES and GB are having difficulties with changing the bank signatories and an in-branch visit is needed. It was suggested that it may be easier to open up a new account.
- The group currently comprise of ES, LM, AM and Anja Schone (AS). New members are welcome to join.
- AS is the link between the group and the school, namely SS and the pupil council.
- AS had attended a Pupil Council meeting and was given a list of priorities from the Pupil Council. Funding grants are being progressed to reflect pupils priorities.
- AS suggested enlisting the help of the school community to help with tasks such as setting up gardening clubs, helping repair bikes, building a wooden beam in the gym hall.

- Emma has emailed FOH to see if they would like to attend this event and awaits a response.


LM will check her diary to see if she can attend the induction to assist ES to speak about HPC and FOH but suggested that she would be happy for another member of HPC to attend in place of herself.

TERM.

<u>Welcome</u>

A warm welcome to everyone.

The current roll of the school is 265 children across 10 classes. The projected roll of the school for session 2023-2024 is 265 children across 10 classes. We have a staffing entitlement of 12.9 plus 0.7 permanent, plus 0.4 temporary additionality (Early Level) so staffing entitlement of 14.0 fte. The current configuration that we are working to is:

P1a - 22 children (Ms Luciana Belardo and Mrs Susan MacDonald)

P1b - 21 children (Mrs Karen Byrne)

P2 - 23 children

P3 - 30 children

P3/4 – 14 P3 children and 11 P4 children

P4 - 30 children

P5 – 33 children

P5/6 - 8 P5 children and 16 P6 children

P6/7 – 21 P6 children and 4 P7 children

P7 - 30 children

Currently, working on configurations within the parameters of maximum class sizes and composite class guidance. As always, at this time of year the class configuration is subject to change. We are delighted to welcome NQT to teaching staff team next session, we will formally meet the new member of the team next week at official event in the Banqueting Hall. We will hold a transition event for all children over the next weeks.

With three weeks until the end of term we are exceptionally busy, planning P1 induction (Mrs Byrne visiting nurseries), supporting P7 transition and preparing leavers' ceremony and party, additional support plan meetings, professional review and development meetings for staff and analysing assessment results in pupil progress meetings to confidently submit Achievement of a Level Data at P1, P4 and P7 stages. We are also analysing our pupil, parent/carer and staff survey results and school data and evidence to write our Standards and Quality Report for this session and plan our School Improvement for next session.

Budget

Pupil Equity Fund spend as planned except for PB element. FOH offered to subsidise this so that the school community could go on a school trip. However, it has not been possible to secure transport. Alternative ideas e.g. end of term fun day.
