Headteacher Report



Welcome

A warm welcome to the first meeting of the new school session, I hope you had a wonderful summer with your children, in spite of the weather.

Start of New Session

It is wonderful to welcome our children and Hallside staff team back to school. The roll of the school is currently 259 children, including 43 new P1 children. All our children have settled incredibly well. A special mention has to go to our outstanding 34 P7s who have demonstrated dedication and kindness in their role as buddies and monitors.

I have a phrase that I often say "Relentless, unwarranted optimism even or especially in the face of adversity". Even during Covid times our mantra at Hallside was 'Let's focus on what we can do not what we cant do.' I have to be very honest with the parent council and say from a staffing perspective this has been the most difficult start to a new session that I have encountered in 25 years teaching.

While we currently have Mrs Lennox in the office who has now received some training, she will be leaving us on Friday as she has secured a post outwith education.

Colleagues from Education Resources have been very supportive to the school and we are working closely with our support services co-ordinator to ensure a more long term plan for staffing the office that ensures succession planning.

Good news! Super Start

I was delighted that we were able to introduce an extended 'Super Start' to all P1-P4 children. Now all P1 to P4 children have the opportunity to enter the school building between 8.50am – 9.00am. This gives our youngest children time to organise themselves, order lunch etc...to start activities at 9.00am and maximise learing time. A huge thank you to our wonderful staff team and fantastic P7 monitors for facilitating this opportunity.

Annual Calendar Parent/Carer Version

We have again this year created a redacted version of the annual school calendar to assist families in planning the year ahead. I hope this is helpful and welcome feedback. Teaching Staff Allocated to Classes

This enables us to have Mrs O'Neill (PT) and Mrs Welsh (Nurture trained) out of class to plan and deliver targeted interventions e.g. Nurture Sessions, Numeracy and literacy interventions.
