Welcome

Lovely to see everyone.

Staffing Update

Pleased to welcome Mrs Tracy Tomlinson to the school on a permanent basis as Support Staff Team Leader. Mrs Tomlinson is learning the routines of the school and continues to receive training to support her to take on her new role.

Mrs Tomlinson is undertaking Parent Portal Training tomorrow and we hope to restart the roll out of this so that we can utilise Parent Portal for Parents' Evening appointments in November.

Budget

No money available in School Budget. Overspend on cleaning and janitorial supplies (paper towels, toilet rolls, soap...) Spend in 22/23 was £1710. Spend currently is £1138. Budget for this line is £770. We are meeting with CTO (Cluster Team Officer) next week to discuss.

The school has £2893 in Replacement Equipment Fund budget.

Pupil Equity Fund has approximately £20,000 (Pupil Equity Fund guaranteed limited time)

School Fund has approximately £5000 in fund (some of this is P7 residential trip money paid in by families.)

Health and Safety

Received confirmation today that Housing and Technical Resources have agreed to pay for the cost of the repairs to the Muga Pitch (caused by vandalism) on this occasion. However, they advised that there is a likelihood of this happening again if preventative measures are not put in place. I have been asked if school budget or fundraising group could pay for this. Due to budget restrictions discussed previously and fundraising causes already prioritised my feeling is that this is not possible.

Cost to heighten the fence and accompanying works is £4886.00.

Thank you to all our families who were able to attend the Doors Open Event.


44 responses to the survey detailed below for your information.


Q.3 I enjoyed the opportunity to visit my child's classroom.


Q.4 I gained an insight into my child's learning environment?

A little more informal time in addition to the presentation would have helped.

A little more time to have a look around the classroom would have been nice although I understand the time pressures to keep the flow of parents moving. Presentation delivered was clear and contained good detail.

Thank you for the opportunity to 'meet the teacher' event. **Kirk** had been quite worried over the summer about the move to **5/6** as he was going to be amongst the youngest in the class and thought that **Mr Hamilton** was going to be 'shouty and strict'. 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

Total cost is £4886.00


