Class Configuration Session 22-23

The current role of the school is 265 across 11 classes. The projected roll of the school for session 2022-2023 is 252 across 10 classes. We have a staffing entitlement of 12.9 plus 0.7 additionality so staffing entitlement of 13.6.

P4 – 30 children

P4/5 – 25 children

P5/6 – 24 children

We are waiting on final confirmation of staffing prior to allocating teachers to classes.

- Engaging with How Good is Our School to evaluate strengths and areas for improvement (In consultation with stakeholders e.g. parents' evening survey and pupil consultation) to include in Standards and Quality Report and to shape School Improvement Plan for next session.
