Literacy and Numeracy

Providing a rich and stimulating curriculum that helps raise standards in literacy and numeracy.

- Continue to refine our literacy curriculum to align reading, writing talking and listening into the 9 text types.
- Host a CLPL in person session with Stephen Graham (16.09.25)
- To work with our Peer School Review groups at Early, First and Second Level to track and moderate writing.
- To develop a whole school and ELC pedagogical approach to Numeracy and Mathematics through the professional learning materials of the SLC VCPA (Verbal, Concrete, Pictorial and Abstract) Professional Learning offer.
- Continue to develop our reading profile to maintain Reading School - Gold Status and refresh our school library

At Blackwood Primary and ELC we will focus on several improvements to support all our learners taking account of National and SLC priorities.

Health and Wellbeing and Sustainability

Improve health and wellbeing for children and families enabling them to flourish.

- To review and develop a whole school and ELC approach to sustainability with a skills based curriculum with a focus on UNCRC Bronze Award.
- Working in partnership with Glasgow Science Centre and Scottish Power Renewables all stages will have participated in a STEM activity funded by Scottish Power and be more aware of a sustainable developmental goal in a rapidly changing world.
