Please note the following points:

- Children should come to school wearing clothes and footwear suitable for Tennis Club – this will be outdoors wherever possible.
- Children should remain in their classroom until all other children from the school have left the school grounds; at this point they will be escorted by their Class Teacher to the Tennis area. They should take all their belongings (bags and jackets) with them as they will no longer be able to enter the school unless they need to use the toilet.
- The Tennis Coach and supervising Parent Helper should remain 2m away from pupils wherever possible. Where this is not possible a note should be taken of those children where direct or proximity contact has occurred.
- Children should bring water bottles for this.
- Parent Helpers are responsible for ensuring pupils leave with their parents at the end of the club they should sign out pupils on behalf of their parents to comply with COVID-19 restrictions.
- Parents should wait, 2m apart in the side section of the school where children enter in the mornings. If there is not enough space in this area to space out as appropriate the front playground can be used. When the club is finished parents will be called to move in a continuous fashion, collecting pupils from the back playground and exiting as they normally would at 3pm down the other side.
- Face masks should be worn by all adults, unless exempt while on the school estate.

# Participatory Budgeting

Many thanks to those parents who completed the survey sent home last week about our obligations around participatory budgeting of a portion of our Pupil Equity Funding. The next step is to look at the responses received in line with the legal requirements around this spending. Pupil Equity Funding must be spent to help raise attainment and close the poverty related gap and while this can be used to target specific pupils, much of the funding spent at Braehead has a more universal benefit and allows us to raise attainment for all and close the gap for more pupils than those affected by poverty.

It is important to remember that the £110 allocated for participatory budgeting has to be justified as a means of raising attainment or closing the gap between our pupils most and least affected by poverty. The questionnaire was not looking for a preference of spend it was asking which aspects of the school day can typically cause families financial strain. Unfortunately this money cannot be used on a one-off trip and would not be sufficient funds to cover transport costs let alone admission costs but it can be used to subsidise costs to outings. Our PEF budget is very small at Braehead and therefore we are limited in the kind of things we can do with limited funds. Below is a list of the most popular responses from those people who completed the form (56% of parent forum). Our job now is to invite **all parents and those pupils currently in P5-7** to vote on the <u>one</u> aspect they think would be most beneficial in allowing all pupils to be included in all aspects of school life and thus contributing to closing the poverty related gap.

This will be sent to families via a google form – no personal details are required, simply put a tick beside the <u>one item</u> you think the  $\pounds 110$  should be put towards.

Items Listed as Causing Financial Strain	What does Braehead currently offer?
Getting dressed for school – uniforms, coats, waterproofs, wellies, gym kit, gym shoes	We held a very successful uniform swap in summer 2019; unfortunately due to COVID we were unable to repeat this in June 2020 but plan to this session.
	Braehead PS facilitated SLC Winter Coat Campaign.
	Winter Clothing support was offered to those families in greatest need.
School Trips - Admission costs, bus costs, lunch	Currently the school subsidises school trips to keep costs as low as possible.
costs	Advance warning is given for panto and residential trips.
Eating – School/Packed lunches/snacks	While we cannot change the cost of school meals we do offer a free breakfast club where cereals, toast, fresh fruit and milk are served daily from 8:15am and 'Toast to Go' for those children arriving on school transport.
Fun Events – Dress down days, Red Nose Day etc	There is currently no charge for Dress Down Days. Sponsored events have not featured this session at all to eliminate any associated costs and celebrations like World Book Day no longer involve a dressing up element.
School Clubs – Equipment, admission costs	There are no charges for any after school clubs; this has been the case for several years.

The item with the most votes will be looked at more closely to determine ways in which we can support as universally as possible. This is a small amount of money but we do want this to have maximum impact. Again, thank you to those who took the time to complete the questionnaire.
