He was very impressed by our poppies and the pupils' knowledge about why we lay poppies and observe a silence.

Clydesdale Foodbank Christmas Foodraiser

We are supporting the foodbank's Christmas Foodraiser appeal again this year. We had a brilliant response last year which made a big difference to many families in Clydesdale. Watch out for more information in next week's SWAY, we will be collecting non-perishable items such as soup, oatcakes, crackers, tinned meat/potatoes/vegetables, Christmas pudding, custard, biscuits, mince pies or

Next Friday (24th November) is Dress Down Day! Pupils do not need to wear uniform, but we would ask that there are no football colours or crop tops! In the past dress down days were a way of raising funds for the school by pupils bringing £1 to school because they were not wearing uniform. A move towards schools being cashless, a focus on the cost of the school day, and of course the impact of covid, has meant that we haven't been focusing on the fund-raising element of dress down days. We do not want to put any additional pressure on anyone – especially in the run up to Christmas, but I am aware that this has possibly not been explained clearly to new families. You can make donations via parentpay but there is no obligation and children can dress down regardless!
