Playground Games and Chalk

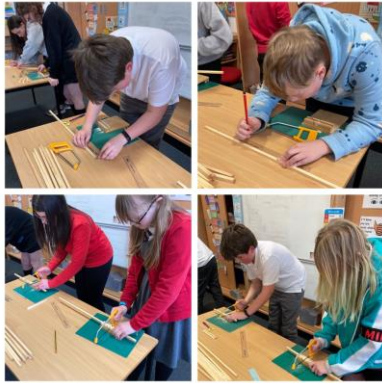


