Adverse Weather Procedures

We are quickly approaching that time of year when the snow arrives! To ensure we are as prepared as we possibly can be, we have outlined below guidance on our procedures for adverse weather. These are fully in line with Operating Procedures as set out by South Lanarkshire Council.

I am sure you will appreciate that weather is unpredictable, decisions are made in conjunction with the local authority and always have pupil safety at the centre.

Adverse Weather Procedures:

- Schools are assumed **open** unless you are notified otherwise.
- We will tell you if the school is closed, there is no need to seek clarification.
- A decision will be made early in the morning using local knowledge of the weather, if
 the school is <u>closed</u> you will receive notice via the school twitter page, text message
 and the school website.
- Sometimes a delayed start of 10am will happen to allow staff and pupils to make a safe journey to school, and ensure we have the correct staff/pupil ratios. You would be notified of a delayed start via the school twitter page, text message and the school website.
- If the school is closed it will also state this on South Lanarkshire's website and Twitter feed. However there can be delay in this appearing.
- As a parent it is your decision to decide if the journey to school is too dangerous. If your child will not be in then please contact the school as you normally would if they were going to be absent.
- Occasionally pupils may need to be sent home due to emergency circumstances. If there is an early closure we will notify you throughout the day. This will usually be because of severe weather. It is essential that emergency contacts are up to date.
- If you are concerned about your child returning home safely please remember you can call the school and arrange to pick them up.
- In the case of severe weather overnight, bus and taxi operators take the decision whether or not to operate routes about 7.30am. They should notify you of their decision. Please liaise with them.

Decisions are made to ensure pupil safety and it is essential for the school and parents to work together to make this happen.
