#### Key Successes-


- We have achieved our Silver Emotion Works School Award! This recognises the quality of work being completed by pupils and staff.
- Emotion Works is planned for termly, and is embedded in our Health Curriculum.
- Almost all pupils can confidently label emotions and identify associated body behaviours, triggers, and regulation strategies.
- Pupils and parents worked on Emotion Works activities together at our Open Morning increasing knowledge of the programme.

# **Priority 2 – Skills for Learning, Life and Work**Key Successes-

- We have achieved out Bronze
   Woodland Trust School Award!
- All pupils have taken part in Forest School activities, cooking skills and digital learning experiences.
- Almost all pupils confidently explain how they use literacy and numeracy skills across the curriculum.
- Attainment in numeracy and reading has increased from last year.





### **Excellence and Equity**

Our literacy and numeracy attainment data is above the SLC, and national average.

We used our Pupil Equity Fund to provide targeted support to pupils for literacy and numeracy, we also used it to reduce the cost of the school day for families.

Family Maths packs were sent home to all P1 and P2 pupils and they used them to practise maths skills at home.

Our Participatory Budget was spent on beyond classroom learning experiences including trips and our playground. The new benches and equipment have been a big hit with pupils, making our playground more enjoyable.



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
