Priority 1 – Emotional Wellbeing

Key Successes-

- We have achieved our Attachment Accreditation 'Act to make a difference' award.
- Almost all pupils can confidently label emotions and identify associated body behaviours, triggers, and regulation strategies.
- Pupils and parents worked on Emotion Works activities together at our Open Morning increasing knowledge of the programme.

Priority 2 – Skills for Learning, Life and Work

Key Successes-

- We have achieved our 'Digital Schools' Award and a 'Sporting School of the Year' Award.
- All pupils have taken part in Forest School activities, cooking skills and digital learning experiences.
- P5 and P6 achieved their John Muir Awards.
- Almost all pupils confidently explain the skills they have developed linking them to SLC skills framework.
- Young Leaders of Learning from P7 successfully twinned with Netherburn Primary and introduced a Travelling Book Trunki to our school. They also introduced Mini School Captains.

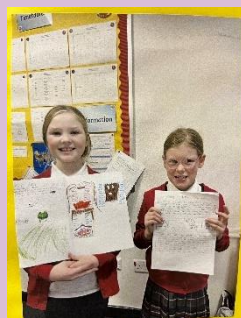


Priority 3 – Developing Writing

- Work sampling shows an increase in pupils' use of effective punctuation and grammar.
- A refreshed punctuation and grammar planner is being used by all staff.

Excellence and Equity

Our literacy and numeracy attainment data is above the SLC, and national average.

We used our Pupil Equity Fund to provide targeted support to pupils for literacy and numeracy, we also used it to reduce the cost of the school day for families.

You + Me = Multiply Maths Programme was a huge success and saw 13 of our families work together to develop numeracy skills.

Our Participatory Budget was spent on beyond classroom learning experiences including trips.
