Poppies


Poppies have been on sale since last Monday for a suggested donation of 20p. All monies raised will go to support the Poppy Scotland Appeal.

Evaluation of Learning

During the w/b 23 September and 30 September staff assessed pupils' progress in literacy, numeracy and Health and Well-being. The data from these assessments will be used by staff to identify next steps in learning. The senior leadership team have also met with staff to review leaners' progress and to review the support in place.

Bikes and Scooters

Just a polite reminder to parents/carers that if your child is scootering or cycling to or from school either supervised or non-supervised, please do not allow your child to cycle close to or around the ASN Transport area. Pupil Equity Funding

In session 2024-2025 Cathkin Primary School has been awarded £115,150 from the Pupil Equity Fund. This fund will be used in a variety of ways to 'Raise Attainment' and close the 'Poverty-Related Attainment Gap' in line with our School Improvement Plans. Head Lice



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We would like to remind all parents/carers of the importance of regular Bugbusting and would appreciate your support by regularly checking your child's hair. Head lice are well camouflaged and hide when disturbed by combing. They do not always

- cause itching, particularly when recently arrived on the head. They may also be few in number and a quick inspection is unlikely to detect them. The following method of
- detection is effective:
- Wash the hair using ordinary shampoo, then use a wide toothed comb to straighten and untangle the hair. It is easier to do this with wet hair and using hair conditioner.
- Once the comb moves freely through the hair, without dragging, switch to a fine-tooth comb. Make sure the teeth of the comb slot into the hair at the roots and draw down to the ends of the hair with every stroke. The comb must be fine enough to catch the lice -size indicated below -do not confuse lice or their eggs with clumps of dandruff or other debris.
- Check the comb for lice after each stroke as you work through the hair section by section, so that the whole head of hair is combed through, then rinse out the conditioner and repeat the combing procedure in the wet hair.
- This can be undertaken on a regular basis -e.g. at routine hair washing sessions -to detect the • presence of lice before they can spread. Check all family members at the same time and arrange treatment when lice are found. If you find lice, then there are two options. Whichever option you choose it is important to recognise that neither will protect against re-infection if head-to-head contact is made with someone with head lice at a later date. You may therefore wish to undertake occasional checks during hair washing sessions.

Option 1: Lotions and creme rinses using insecticides

Do not use lotions or rinses unless you find a living moving louse. Check all close family/friends by the "wet combing" method, as described, and treat anyone who is found to have lice at the same time, to prevent re-infection.

Option 2: The "Bug Busting" treatment method

This aims at systematic removal of live lice by combing through the hair and physically removing any lice found. Success depends largely upon adopting a painstaking approach.

Volunteering to support at Parents' Forum planned events - PVG Procedure Note

The procedure for applying for both a New Member and an Existing Member PVG is outlined below: For any PVG applications the following information is required -

3 items of ID:

- one to be photographic, •
- one confirming the applicant's address (dated within the last 3 months)
- one confirming the applicant's date of birth.

This information is required whether or not the applicant is already an existing member of the PVG scheme or are newly looking to join the scheme.

- If the applicant is already a member we need to know what vulnerable group/s they are • currently registered to work with i.e. children, adults or both.
- If already a member can they confirm their PVG number if possible.

The Lead Person of the Parents' Forum will then complete the other information required:

- What vulnerable group/s they will be working with under SLC (children/adults/both)
- Work Location •

- The volunteers email address
- If the applicant will be paying for the PVG themselves or SLC are paying for it (Parent helpers PVG's council funded & Student's PVG's will be charged to the applicant).

All proofs of ID should be handed to the Lead Person for copying and verification. All proofs of ID will then be submitted along with the other information required.
