

Reading 'Jigsaw' Learning at Home Tasks for Infants: *Pupil Choice*

<p>Explore and choose from lots of different books.</p>	<p>Talk about your likes and dislikes in a story.</p>	<p>Read aloud from left to right or join in parts of the story that repeat or rhyme.</p>	<p>Clarify understanding of tricky words or the story itself using clues in the book/ sounding out/use the picture etc. Have a go!</p>
<p>Predict what will happen next to the characters/ setting/story.</p>	<p>Talk about fiction and non-fiction books: discuss differences and similarities.</p>	<p>Skim a page quickly using your eyes (finger to help) to get the main idea.</p>	<p>Scan to find key information (eg sounds and common words) in books/texts/the environment.</p>
<p>Copy part of the story out. Can you remember to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops?</p>	<p>Ask and answer literal questions. Use question words to help: Who? When? Where? Why?</p>	<p>Summarise the story: Tell someone about what happened in the story using... At the beginning/in the middle and at the end...</p>	<p>Draw a picture of the setting, characters and what happened in your story. Label your picture.</p>
<p>Talk about the character, the story and where it happened.</p>	<p>Link characters/story to my own life eg Has that ever happened to</p>	<p>Play letter and word games.</p>	<p>Now choose another book/type of text and start again...</p>

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
