<p><b>Activity 1</b> <b>Main Ideas</b></p> <p>Create a comic strip in which you identify 5 main events from a novel you have read. Remember to include captions to describe each event in detail and illustrations.</p>	<p><b>Activity 2</b> <b>Metalinguistics</b></p> <p>Read the next chapter in your class novel. Identify 6 tricky words from the chapter you found while reading. Discuss some of these words with a family member at home. Create a metalinguistics table to write down what you think the words mean.</p>	<p><b>Activity 3</b> <b>Book Review</b></p> <p>Write a book review on a book of your choice. Remember to include information on the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Character and setting</li> <li>• Main events/twists in the story</li> <li>• Recommendations</li> <li>• Star rating</li> </ul>	<p><b>Activity 4</b> <b>Questioning</b></p> <p>For this task, you have the chance to become the teacher! Based on one of the chapters from a book you are reading at home; try to create some questions for a partner to answer. Think about questions that will encourage your partner to read between the lines.</p>
<p><b>Activity 5</b> <b>Visualisation</b></p> <p>Create a visualiser of a character from a book you are reading. Remember to think about the character's appearance and personality.
