### **Participatory Budget**

This session we gave you the opportunity to have your say on what we could spend 5% of our PEF money on. The main purpose of this 5% is to help reduce the financial costs of sending your child to school. All staff and pupils voted as well as parents/ guardians during our Parents' Evening in October. The results overwhelmingly stated that all stakeholders wanted us to spend the money on School Trips.

As our Cost of the School Day policy states, we will offer school trips every 2 years, thus reducing the cost to families for such an expensive activity. Last year, we arranged for activities to come into school, at zero cost to children and families.

Following discussions with the Parent Council last week, they have offered to contribute £10 per pupil to the cost of a school trip. This is an amazing offer, and we cannot thank them enough! Along with the PB funds, we now plan to offer school trips **free of charge** to all our learners. Trips will take place in Term 3.

### **Young Leaders of Learning**

On Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> November, Mrs Moffat and our Ambassadors visited Law Primary School to participate in training for Young Leaders of Learning. This is a program that allows pupils across schools to come together to evaluate the learning and teaching going on in their own classrooms. We have been partnered with High Mill Primary School, and the pupils will now be given the opportunity to take part in learning walks, consultations and celebrations. The pupils will develop many new skills, including teamwork, communication and self-confidence. Thanks to Mrs Moffat for taking the lead on this very exciting opportunity!

### **Improving our Writing**

As part of our School Improvement Plan, we are continuing to focus on Writing across all classes. This has included the implementation of Talk for Writing.

This session, we are also trialling a new SLC program called 'Improving our Writing' (IOW), which focuses on the core skills of writing through the delivery of 'Sprints'. The Sprints involve daily writing activities, lasting around 10-15 minutes, and last for 3 weeks. This month, our Sprint focuses on the skill of sentence expansion.

### **Sharing Learning**



We make regular use of our Google Classrooms to share learning going on in our classrooms every day and we hope that you enjoy seeing the photos and reading the updates! By the end of this term, we will also create a *Learning and Teaching* Sway, that will give you the chance to see what your child's class has been up to over the last few weeks! ### SANTA DASH EVENT - FRIDAY 5TH DECEMBER
