OCTOBER GROWTH MINDSET MANTRA: MY BRAIN IS LIKE A MUSCLE THAT GROWS

Studies have shown that the brains of people who are born deaf are essentially 're-wired' to use the area of the brain typically used for processing sound to assist with touch and vision.

The brain of a London cab driver has been shown to grow as they memorize over 25,000 city streets to pass their licensing examination!

By teaching pupils about brain plasticity, we are reinforcing the message that they can learn anything, with practice, perseverance and effort. It is by taking on new challenges, pushing our comfort zones, that our brains make big changes!

This month, we are encouraging our pupils to 'grow their brains' by focusing on their learning, embracing new challenges and working hard to overcome anything they find tricky! They can do this at home too, perhaps by learning to ride their bike, reading a new book or joining a new club to learn a new skill!

This is for adults and children, giving you the chance to work together!














Straw and Order - Christmas Show 2025

Head Lice

Schools have been recommended to provide regular information to parents about the detection and treatment of head lice infection.

You are already aware that you are entitled to free prescriptions insecticide lotions and the "Bug Buster" kit (a non-insecticide alternative) which is also available on prescription.

ADVERSE WEATHER ACTION PLAN

Our school has a very clear "Adverse Weather" Policy, which is visibly displayed in our entrance at the office. This is a vital document that explains our procedures in the event of inclement winter weather. Please read the following arrangements very carefully and keep them somewhere safe in the event they must be actioned.

IN THE EVENT OF **FROST OR ICE**, the following paths will be treated:

- The path leading from the P1 gate.
- The main path towards the front door and side gate.
- The path from the side gate, around the walls of the building, as far as the canteen doors.
- A path from the back gate, along the MUGA and to the side of the building, as far as the canteen doors.

All **P1** children should come in using the P1 path as normal. However, if we feel the path is still not safe at 8.40am, we will keep the gate closed and P1 pupils should come in via the main gate and will be brought in through the front door. Older siblings can come with them.

All **P2-P7** children should come in via the side gate or back gate. No pupil should walk round the building from the P1 gate, as this will not have been treated. If we feel the playground is still not safe, we will keep the back gate closed and all children should come in via the side gate, at their usual time.

IN THE EVENT OF **SNOW**, the following paths will be cleared:

- The main path towards the front door and side gate.
- The path from the side gate, around the walls of the building, as far as the canteen doors.

ENTERING THE SCHOOL ON SNOW DAYS

- PRIMARY 1 Pupils in P1 will be brought in via the main front door from 8.40am. They will be taken to their classrooms and supervised there. Siblings should come in with them.
- PRIMARY 2-4 Pupils in P2-4 will be brought into the canteen from 8.40am, via the canteen doors in the rear playground. They should enter the school via the side gate in the car park. All other gates will be closed. They will be supervised in the canteen until they go to class at 9.00am.
- PRIMARY 5-7 Pupils in P5-7 will be brought into the gym hall from 8.40am, via the gym hall doors in the rear playground. They should enter the school via the side gate in the car park. All other gates will be closed. They will be supervised in the canteen until they go to class at 9.00am.

Please do not send your children before these times, so that we can avoid waiting in the cold!

Siblings should come together.

Breakfast Club will run as normal.

All <u>emergency contact numbers</u> should be up to date and <u>numbers that are answered</u>. We are always mindful that the snow may not be far away. It is very important that we can reach you if we decide to close the school. We never make this decision lightly and it may be that it is safer to keep your children in school until the weather clears a little.

If the decision is made before school begins for the day, we will put a message out on our App and add a notice to our website: we will also try to use social media through the Parent and Carer Facebook page.

It may also be likely that we opt for a <u>delayed opening</u>. If this is the case, we will give you clear guidance about what time your child should be brought to school: please do not bring them before the stated time. This allows the staff to get to school safely.

In the event of adverse weather, please do not call the school directly as there may not be anyone to answer your call – keep checking the App, school website and SLC twitter feed.
