We have grounds to be proud of, but they do take a lot of work!
















Halloween Fun

OCTOBER GROWTH MINDSET MANTRA: MY BRAIN IS LIKE A MUSCLE THAT GROWS

"The brain can grow and change in incredible ways when pushed...with dedicated effort and practice (humans) are capable of making incredible, long-lasting changes to our brain throughout our lifetime."

Studies have shown that the brains of people who are born deaf are essentially 're-wired' to use the area of the brain typically used for processing sound to assist with touch and vision.

The brain of a London cab driver has been shown to grow as they memorize over 25,000 city streets to pass their licensing examination!

By teaching pupils about brain plasticity, we are reinforcing the message that they can learn anything, with practice, perseverance and effort. It is by taking on new challenges, pushing our comfort zones, that our brains make big changes!

This month, we are encouraging our pupils to 'grow their brains' by focusing on their learning, embracing new challenges and working hard to overcome anything they find tricky! They can do this at home too, perhaps by learning to ride their bike, reading a new book or joining a new club to learn a new skill!

School Uniform

- We have a pop-up shop available in our side foyer area. This is open daily. All items are free.
- Our uniform can be purchase from local suppliers in Lanark and Wishaw.
- While badged items are available, these are not compulsory.

Travelling and Transport

- We will access local facilities where possible, to avoid the need for transport.
- All transport costs are subsidised by the school using PEF/School Fund.
- We encourage all families to apply for their Under 22 free bus pass.

Learning

- We will never charge for any core curricular activities, including swimming and cooking.
- All stationery items will be provided by the school.
- If extra resources are required for home learning, parents are encouraged to contact the school to request these.

Friendships

- Poverty Awareness will be taught as part of our HWB program.
- We will reduce non-uniform days to avoid stigma and the pressure for families to purchase new items.
- Poverty-related bullying will be treated seriously and logged appropriately.

School Excursions

- We will cap the cost of school trips, subsidising these using PEF/School funds
- We will seek in-school activities to reduce the need for outings.
- School trips will only take place every 2 years.
- We will seek grants and subsidies to reduce the cost of trips further.

Eating

- We have a free breakfast club every morning, open to all pupils.
- We will ensure no child starts the day without breakfast.
- We will offer surplus fruit and snacks to pupils daily.
- In the event of surplus menu items, we will offer 'seconds' at the end of each lunch setting.

Fun Events

- We will plan our annual calendar to spread the cost of any fun events.
- There will be at least 2 free events each session for every pupil.
- Our pop-up shop will include items such as Christmas Jumpers and Halloween costumes.


- There will be no cost to any extracurricular club.
- Every pupil will have the opportunity to take part in one free extra-curricular club.
- For any trips linked to school clubs (sports events, JRSOs etc) there will be no charge for transport.

Learning at Home

- We will provide pupils with the resources they need to learn at home
- Google Classroom will be optional to reduce the pressure of access to wi-fi or digital devices.
- We will host a free homework club for pupils in P5-7 weekly.

Attitudes to Poverty

- We will review our Cost of the School Day procedures and policy on an annual basis.
- Our COSD policy will be reviewed with all stakeholders.
- Our COSD practices will be include in the Equity section of our Improvement Plan.
