STRATEGIC PRIORITY 1

To continue to develop and implement high quality teaching and learning experiences in Literacy.

Plan for reading through a book, rhyme or sound of the month.

Create Literacy story sacks that have a focus on questioning, rhyme, phonological awareness and digital technologies.

Nursery staff to complete Leadership Bookbug training to enhance story sessions.

Staff will monitor levels of engagement in Literacy through the Lueven Scale, adapting experiences accordingly.

Practitioners will engage in Talk for Writing and Improving Our Writing training.

Staff will attend Musical Markers training to enhance Talking and Listening experiences.

Musical instruments will be incorporated into the playroom to improve pupils ability to discriminate sounds and enhance syllable segmentation.

Staff will implement 'Grab and Go' sylabble and inital sounds bags.



STRATEGIC PRIORTY 2

To further develop pupils' knowledge and understanding of sustainability.

Staff will audit and evaluate resources and spaces available linked to learning for sustainability.

Staff will develop provocations/ spaces for pupils to develop knowledge of sustainability.

Staff will use the United Nations Global Goals provocation cards, incorporate sustainability when planning across the curriculum.

Staff will incorporate aspects of 'sustainability into Forest Friday activities.



STRATEGIC PRIORTY 3

To improve the wellbeing of our learners by embedding an attachment and trauma sensitive approach.

Staff will undertake training in Emotion coaching to support relationships and improve pupil wellbeing.

Staff will work with L. Burns to develop knowledge and understanding of the Emotion Works programme.

Staff will plan and implement Emotion Works within HWB to support pupils' self-regulation strategies.

Staff will work collegiately with P1-7 towards the learning outcomes for our third pledge- 'See the Whole Person'.

Staff will provide opportunities for parents, carers and families to further develop their knowledge and understanding of Attachment and Trauma Sensitive approaches.
