### Applications Closing Date

The **closing date** for all Early Learning Class applications, for next session, is **February 28**<sup>th</sup>. If you have a child, or know of any children, due to start nursery next session families should contact the school and make an appointment to complete an application form. Any applications made after this date will be classed as late applications and this decreases the chance of securing your first choice of nursery.

#### Family Friday

As part of our ongoing commitment to partnerships with families we are going to invite parents/carers into the playroom on Fridays to collect their children instead of collecting them at the entrance doorway. This change will be effective from Friday 16<sup>th</sup> February. Parents/carers should arrive at their usual time to collect their child. 
#### Lunchtime Learning
