Key Questions

Our team use some key questions to encourage creativity, understanding and analysis. Three key questions that we use are I wonder why....?, What do you think? and What if...?

We are also encouraging our children to use these questions when playing and learning with adults and their friends to promote curiosity in the world around them.

Target setting



This session we are introducing personalised targets linked to Numeracy, Health and Wellbeing and Literacy. Targets will be identified through learner conversations amongst our children, their key workers and families. Targets will be personalised for each child and should be attainable. Targets will be stored in children's Learning Journals which are kept in our playroom. Our children love to share their Learning Journals, so please take the time to look at them with your child during weekly Family Fridays, Stay and Play events and Parents' Evenings.

If you have, or know of, a child, who will turn three before 28/02/26 please contact our school office to make an appointment to complete an application form with Mrs Clow or Mrs Moran.


Appointment times are available on the last Wednesday of every month but if this does not suit your family, we organise another suitable time.
