Links to Respect and Teamwork What's App chats

I wanted to bring to your attention that the legal age for WhatsApp (and Snapchat) is 13. At school, we are seeing more and more cases of children using this platform, and using it inappropriately, leading to high levels of distress for children. Please regularly check your child's phone to make sure they are not subjected to any online bullying or being unkind to others. Children in primary school are not developmentally mature enough to manage social media on their own and need careful guidance and support. That is why the age limit is in place. Unknown persons can easily be added into chats making your child vulnerable. For the safety of your own child, please keep a very close monitor of who and what they are communicating. I've attached a parents' guide to help. I would encourage you to make sure you are aware of the dangers your child can face. Thank you.
