Work will not be provided for your child to complete whilst they away, but we would ask for your support on their return to 'catch up' with any vital tasks.

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#### **Playground Supervision**

We have had a few enquiries/complaints regarding playground supervision before 9am. This matter was discussed at the Parent Council Meeting in September. South Lanarkshire Council and the Scottish Government identify the need for schools to provide an adult presence in the playaround before the school day. Within Kirkton Primary our Janitor provides this presence from 8.45am. In addition to this at least 1 but often 2 additional members of staff are in the playground to welcome the children and ensure a smooth start to the day. These adults are not located purely at the gates and will move around the whole playground, children should not leave the playground once they have entered, this is a message we are sharing in the school and would ask all parents to reinforce this message at home. The staff in the playground are able to sort out any issues which may occur.

#### **Lost Property**

Please assist in preventing items of school uniform being lost or misplaced by labelling all items of clothing, footwear, bags and packed lunches with the child's

#### **PE Lessons**

Please ensure children come to school with appropriate gym clothes – plain white or dark shorts, plain white t-shirt and suitable shoes or plimsols. All children will take part in a minimum two hours quality PE per week. If your child is unable to participate, please inform the class teacher in writing. Please remember that all jewellery should be removed for PE lessons, including earrings.

#### **Water Bottles**

Children are encouraged to bring a water bottle to school every day and to keep hydrated during lessons. Only water is permitted during class time. Children should take their bottle home each night to be washed and refilled, pupils should not be using the school water coolers first thing in the morning. It is recommended that bottles be 'BPA Free' or 'PET Free' and that they are washed with soapy water each night. The re-use of disposable water bottles is not recommended, and we are not able to provide children with cups. Children may bring metal water bottles, but glass bottles are not permitted.

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#### **Fizzy Drinks**

Cans and bottles of carbonated drinks, including energy drinks are not permitted in school.

#### **School Photographer**

The School Photographer will visit on <u>Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> October.</u> Remember to wear your full school uniform (no PE uniforms please) and bring your fabulous smiles.

#### **Mobile Telephones**

Pupils are discouraged from bringing their mobile devices to school however, if they require them for after school, they must remain switched off and in school bags at all times in line with our Mobile Technologies policy. Children are not permitted to bring any other personal electronic devices to school.

#### Dogs

A reminder that only guide/assistance dogs are allowed into the school grounds to ensure the safety of all members of the school community. This includes the area outside the main entrance.

#### **Learning Through Play in Primary One**

Play is a very important stage of learning for all children. It allows them to explore and understand the world through role-play, imagination, and 'rehearsal' of real events. It encourages the development of social skills, turn taking, sharing and also improves vocabulary. At Kirkton, we integrate play into the Primary 1 experience. Miss Burns, our P1 Teacher, has planned and organised their classroom environment to promote an active learning approach and children have regular opportunities to engage in play-based learning. The core skills of 'reading, writing and arithmetic' are still at the heart of the curriculum for P1 learners and, by working in a stimulating and motivating classroom environment, children can explore literacy and numeracy in contexts that are relevant, engaging and fun. Play based learning also allows children to work in small groups and one to one with their class teacher more often. Through a 'teaching activity', children will be introduced to spelling, phonological awareness, numbers, counting etc. Please visit our school website and Twitter feed regularly throughout the year to follow the progress of Primary 1 and our play-based approach to learning.

We are delighted to be leading the way with this locally and are pleased to have welcomed colleagues to observe the innovative practice in P1.

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#### **Cycling to School**

Children are encouraged to cycle or scoot to school. Children are recommended to wear a suitable helmet and reflective clothing and must dismount their bike in the playground and push it to the bike rack. The school cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage to bikes/scooters etc. while on school property. Electric scooters and 'hover boards' etc. are not permitted.

#### **Medical Information**

Please inform the office staff of any medical conditions that may affect your child in school. If your child requires prescribed medication during the school day, please discuss this with a member of office or management staff. Children are not permitted to have any medication in school without the completion of a medical administration form. Medicines should not be sent to school in pupil bags.

#### Establishment Improvement Plan 2018/19

This year, the focuses of our curriculum improvement work will be on Literacy, with a focus on further improving pupil attainment through the implementation of the NLC approach to Active Literacy and Numeracy, to further improve attainment through the implementation of Big Maths approaches to Numeracy & Maths.

As part of the Scottish Attainment Challenge, we will continue to seek opportunities to offer targeted support to specific groups of children who may need additional support or resources to achieve and attain.
