Head Teacher's Welcome

Dear Parents,

I can't quite believe that I am writing the final newsletter of this academic session! Where does the time go? Our Primary 7 pupils have been to visit Carluke High School and our new P1 pupils have almost finished their transition programme for the year.

I am currently working on the class structure for next session and it is my intention to let you know who your child's class teacher is when this is finalised and we have received further guidance from South Lanarkshire Council. As in previous years, there will be composite classes within the school. Please be reassured that we take many factors into consideration, looking at working groups as well as friendships. Our school roll for next session will be 203 children, therefore, South Lanarkshire Council have informed us there will be 8 classes.

Thank you to those who have contributed to our questionnaires recently to help us identify our next steps in improving our school. Our school improvement priorities will be based on:

- Improving attainment in literacy with a continued focus on Extended Writing as well as a new focus on spelling
- Improving attainment in numeracy through problem solving and application of maths in real life contexts.
- Improving Learning & Teaching with a focus on quality learning opportunities across the school.
- Improving learners' mental and social wellbeing through wellbeing and developing a rights based curriculum.

Copies of the improvement plan will be issued once this has been finalised with South Lanarkshire Council. Our school improvement plan will also outline details of how we intend to spend the Pupil Equity Fund to raise attainment and narrow the poverty related attainment gap. The Pupil Equity Fund will align directly with our school improvement agenda.
