

# Kirkton Primary School Home Learning



This year we have altered our homework. We are using a grid format. Pupils should still complete homework regularly, but it is hoped that this will fit in with busy lives, clubs etc. These tasks are the same for all pupils in Primary 2 to Primary 7 and are broad enough for all children to be able to complete. Not all tasks are suitable for all spelling words or books and chapters. They have been created to allow children to share and discuss their class learning with you. There will be opportunities for children to share their homework with their class teacher during our 'rest weeks'.

This grid should be used all year and each week you should try to complete the following.

One Spelling Task Complete one tasks. Your spelling words will be given by your teacher each week.

One Reading Task Complete one Reading/Writing tasks using your reading book or personal reader for that week. Reading

aloud and reading practise may also be given.

One Maths Task This will be given to you by your class teacher.

One Family Learning Tasks Family Learning Tasks are suggested as a way of getting the whole family learning together. These are

aimed to be fun tasks that can involve the whole family. There is no set number of these that should be

completed. They are simply suggestions of ways to extend learning at home.

For all tasks, write the number of the task you complete in your homework jotter as well as the task if needed.

Your teacher may give you specific tasks to complete some weeks and these will be noted in your diary or homework jotter. All completed homework should be handed in to your teacher on a four weekly basis (see dates below). There will then be a 'rest' week. During this week, teachers will look at the homework and discuss it. This may be individual or whole class, we will also use this week to celebrate successes.

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<u>Spelling Activities</u> - Complete at least one task per week using your spelling words. Write the title of the task in your homework jotter.

Education City/IDL Cloud

Play an Education City spelling game or use IDL Cloud, if this is one of your tasks (not all children).

Are you a songwriter?

Use your words in a song or a rap.

Silly Sentences

Write a silly sentence using each spelling word e.g. My dog wears a blue and purple dress when he takes a bath.

**Back Writing** 

Use your finger to write your spelling words on someone's back, they then have to guess what the word is.

Rhyming Words

Find rhyming words for all your words.

Air Writing

Use your finger to write the words in the air, can someone at home guess the word?

Spelling Bee

Practise spelling your words out loud to someone at home.

Pyramid Writing

"Pyramid Write" your words e.g. cat c

ca cat

Type 'em

Type your words on the computer. Can you change the font and the colour?

Alphabetical Order

Write your words in alphabetical order.

Practise Test

Ask someone at home to test you on your spelling. Write them all down and have them marked.

Family Spelling Test

Give an adult in your family a spelling test, can they use the words in a sentence?

Hangman

Play a game of hangman with your words.

Roll a word

Roll (or throw) a ball back and forth to a partner. You say the 1<sup>st</sup> letter and your partner says the 2<sup>nd</sup> and so on.

Writing outside

Use chalk or water to write your words outside.

Sentence Please

Use your words in an interesting sentence, underline your spelling words.

Word search

Make your words into a word search, can someone at home find them all?

Be an author/poet

Write a story or poem using all of your words. Remember to underline your spelling words with a coloured pencil.

Words without vowels
Write out your words
replacing each vowel with a
line, then go back to the
beginning and fill in all the

vowels.

Word Race

How many times can you write each word in 30 seconds.

Newsy Words

Cut out letters from newspapers/magazines or junk mail and use them to make your spelling words.

Rainbow Writing

Write your spelling words using different colours.

**Bubble Letters** 

Write your words in bubble letters, then colour them in with coloured pencils or crayons.

Flashcards

Make flashcard for your words, can your draw a picture on each to help you remember.

Own Choice

Do you have any other ways you can learn your spellings? Show us what you've done.

Home Learning Activities – The following tasks are suggested as Family Learning Tasks. We have designed them to encourage your whole family to learn together, they are all about having fun. Be a responsible citizen by doing something for charity e.g. donating clothes/toys.

Go for a seasonal walk and draw a picture, write and story/poem about it.

Spend time with an older relative finding out how things have changed since they were your age.

Practise a talent you have, put on a show for your family or friends.

## Photography

Learn how to take a photograph. Take different photographs using different features e.g. black & white.

## Community Clubs

Have fun at a local club. Where did you go? What did you do?

Learn how to look after your pet. What do they need to make sure they stay fit and healthy?

Make a Den using different materials, take a photograph of it or draw a picture of it.

## Shopping

Help an adult make a shopping list, what shop did you go to or did you do it online?

#### Sunset

Watch the sunset, what could you see/hear? How did you feel?

Write or draw the main events of your book in the correct order.

## Own Choice

How does one of your character feel? Why do they feel this way? How do you know?

## Title

Do you think you book has a suitable title? Why? If this was not the title can you create a new one.

Reading Aloud

Read a book aloud to a member of your family, try

## Illustrator

Pick your favourite part of the story/chapter and draw a picture to illustrate it.

### **Book Critic**

Be a book critic. Would you recommend this book to a friend? Why?

## Treasure

Create a treasure map of the important places mentioned in your book
