The University of Glasgow is continuing their partnership with the Sutton Trust to run the Sutton Trust Summer School from Monday 29 June – Friday 3 July 2026. The Sutton Trust is a Widening Access charity that aims to support university entry for young people who face additional challenges in their education.

The Sutton Trust Summer School (STSS) is a residential programme designed to give pupils a taste of university life. The young people will work online at home on Monday 29 June before travelling to campus on the Tuesday morning, where they will stay until the afternoon for Friday

3 July. All costs, including accommodation, travel, and food, are covered by the Sutton Trust and the University of Glasgow.

There are four streams, and pupils can apply for one, related to the subjects they are most interested in studying at university. These are Arts & Social Sciences, Medical & Life Sciences, Engineering, or Common Law. Please note that Common Law is only available for pupils based in Northern Ireland, England, or Wales. P Windfarm Connect2 Renewables Employability Fund – S4-S6 pupils

The following information about the Windfarm Connect 2 Renewables Employability Fund has been shared with S4-S6 pupils and posted in S4-S6 Google Classrooms:

Due to your proximity to the Kype Muir and Middle Muir windfarms, if you plan on leaving at the end of this school year, you could be entitled to up to £500 (if going to college/university) or £200 if going into employment/apprenticeship.

This is a grant payment that does not need to be paid back. The only real requirement is that you live within the required postcode areas.

I would encourage you all to apply if eligible - it is free money that could be really useful as you start your post-school journey.

To apply, you really just need to complete a form but you won't receive the money until you start college/university as they will need to see your student card. You can make enquiries now though by contacting: connect2renewables@southlanarkshire.co.uk or telephone 0800 9520 070.
