Explain what **fossils** are and what they tell us about dinosaurs.

Dig for some toy dinosaurs in sand, taking on the role of a palaeontologist.

Draw a picture of the type of environment the dinosaurs would have lived in millions of years ago.

Sort dinosaurs into different groups.

Find out what different dinosaurs liked to eat.

Order dinosaurs by **size**.

Use building blocks to build a cage to contain a dangerous dinosaur.

Make a 3D dinosaur model from playdough.

Colour pictures of **dinosaurs**.

Make a mini dinosaur environment using boxes, stones, mud, playdough, sand, leaves and other materials.

Use my voice to show the different noises and roars I think dinosaurs would have made.

Try to move around in different ways to represent different dinosaurs.

Label the parts of a dinosaur.

Read dinosaur **fact cards** to find out more about dinosaurs.

Tell someone at home about my favourite dinosaurs, describing what they like to eat and how they behave.

Write some simple **sentences** about dinosaurs.

Talk about something I am afraid of and discuss why it frightens me.

Design a **poster** that encourages others to be brave.

Write down three words to describe the personality and behavioural traits of a Tyrannosaurus Rex.

Draw a picture of a dinosaur that I think is most like me and tell someone why.
