# Verb Tenses (past and present)

The owl **is flying** through the wood.

Sometimes verbs are written in the present tense. They tell us what is happening now.



Last night the owl **flew** through the wood.

Sometimes verbs are written in the past tense.
They tell us what happened some time ago.
